- Director was a keynote speaker at an annual conference in drug development organized by the National Institute of Pharmaceutical Education & Research in India, at the request of UIC faculty.
- UIC met with eleven large Japanese electronics companies to discuss licensing Procter and Gamble technology; Canon committed to a license, subject to attorney approval, that will be leveraged in Q4 enforcement activities against 40 additional targets.
- Received strong industry response to requests for meetings to discuss UIC technologies (32 scheduled to date) with large pharmaceutical companies during the April BIO2006 held in Chicago.
- Disclosures increased 131% compared to FY2005 Q3.
- College of Business students continue to win national business plan competitions.

- Lesley Millar was named Director; she had previously served as Interim Director.
- Tradeshows attended include: Reliability & Maintainability Symposium, where 3 licenses were signed for Mobius software, the International Technology and Persons with Disabilities Conference, to promote the Web Accessibility software, Photonics West, the AUTM Annual Meeting, and NanoTech Investing Forum.
- Recruited 8 interns from Law, Engineering, and MBA.
- VetMed faculty presentation on OTM services and functions.
- Six corporations visited OTM to discuss technologies available for license and further development: Freescale Semiconductor, Kimberly Clark, PPG Industries, Calgon, John Deere, and Sony.

- Total funding commitments to-date now approximately \$11.0 million with over 7:1 "leverage" of third-party investor and grant funding.
- Existing portfolio companies are making notable progress. Highlights include: **iCyt** – Major new product launch at the Annual ISAC Congress in Quebec City in May; E \$10mm 06 revenue; **Riverglass** – Completed additional sales of intelligence Desktop including State of Iowa; **Chromatin** – Attained major technical milestones and completed \$3mm bridge funding; **Phoenix Energy** – Completed \$4mm Series A raise, initiating roll-up strategy of Illinois Basin Coal properties; **Psi-tech** – Completed \$750k Series A financing, hired initial management team.
- Several new projects underway in development pipeline including: **One Llama** – Web-based music recommender system based on work by staff at NCSA and the Dept. of Library Sciences at UIUC; **Cbana** – New project involving Mark Shannon and Rich Masel in airborne chemical and pathogenic sensing microsystems at UIUC.
